

Pastoral Reflection

Holy Week

Emptiness in the Western World is not something easily embraced. Empty stomachs, empty bank accounts, empty hearts all have negative connotations. Here in the West we often see these as issues that need to be fixed by a good TV commercial campaign.

Even Jesus talks about helping the hungry, poor and those poor in Spirit. Seemingly the things or those who are empty need fixing. Or do they?

My dad recently took a trip to Israel. As they were traveling they passed by on the side of the road an empty tomb with the stone placed next to it. This empty thing is not like the rest. It's not something that needs to be fixed. Instead the empty tomb is something to be celebrated.

Easter is about celebrating the emptiness. Celebrating that death doesn't have the last word. Jesus was raised. The tomb is empty. He is not here. He is Risen!

This Easter we celebrate emptiness. The emptiness of a specific tomb thousands of years ago; that gives us hope today. Hope that all of our problems, all of our fears, all of our concerns about tomorrow and the worries of what will be, are held in the hands of a Risen Savior. Thanks be to God for emptiness.

April's Outreach Partner: Feed My Starving Children

Every day 18,000 children die from starvation. Feed My Starving Children (FMSC), along with nearly 600,000 volunteers, has packaged over 100 million meals for starving children in nearly 70 countries all over the world. Each Feed My Starving Children meal provides the key nutrients a starving child needs to survive and thrive.

Founded in 1987, FMSC is a Christian nonprofit that provides nutritionally complete meals for starving, malnourished and hungry people. The prepackaged dry meals- costing less than a quarter each to make- are funded and assembled by donor-volunteers in the U.S. Their in-country partners use the food to prevent starvation and curb malnourishment in children and families worldwide.

Sonya Lodahl's Faith Journey

I grew up in a Lutheran home, mostly in Rice Lake, Wisconsin. When I was 17, I did something that was against my moral code that affected me for many, many years. It wasn't a crime, but I intensely regretted that deed and my self-perceived transgression caused me to feel unworthy of God's love.

I tried many ways to get past this. I read self-help books. I became a Catholic. Nothing helped. I cried at every church service. My first marriage ended– another failure. My poor self-image led me to more poor decisions, including marrying an alcoholic.

After over 20 years of family drama, I divorced my second husband. Two years later he decided to go to alcoholism treatment and asked me to stand by him through treatment. I agreed, and we became heavily involved in aftercare, AA and Al-Anon, and remarried.

The Twelve Steps of Al-Anon became a pivot point for me, although certainly not overnight. When the time came to go through the 5th of the 12 steps, which is: "Admitted to God, to ourselves and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs," I met with the pastor of the church in Rice Lake. The pastor at that time had come late to the ministry after having been a successful salesman.

When I left the church that day, after receiving Pastor Phil's counsel and benediction, I felt as though I had been reborn. I finally understood that God's love is unconditional and included me, no matter how unworthy I had thought myself for so long.

Every time I receive the sacraments and hear the words "the body of Christ, given for you" and "the blood of Chirst, shed for you," tears spring to my eyes at this wondrous gift that was given for me and for all of God's children.
