



School Supplies for NEAR Students

It is time again for the St. James congregation to help get NEAR students ready for the start of school in Sept. Many supplies are needed, The Caring Tree Org, has been asked to help but more is needed. Caribou Partners will help bag supplies on Aug. 7th. The supplies will be distributed to the clients Aug. 25-29. Help is always needed at this time. If you choose to donate money, it will be used for items needed- please make your check to St, James with NEAR- School on memo line.

In 2013 NEAR served 170 families with 434 students. The totals were: 216 elementary, 103 middle school, and 115 high school students. The plan is to do-75— $K/1^{st}$, 75— $2^{nd}/3^{rd}$, 75— $4^{th}/5^{th}$, 120—Middle School, and 100—High School for the 2014/2015 school year.

These items are needed: backpacks, loose leaf paper (wide and college rule), pencils, erasers, colored pencils, glue, many two-pocket folders (red, yellow, blue, green), pencil sharpeners (with closed container), markers (fat/thin tip), pencil boxes-pouches, scissors (blunt), highlight pens

The schools NEAR serves are: Forest, Lakeview, Meadow Lake, Plymouth Middle, Robbinsdale Middle, and Cooper High School.

Faith Journeys– What Are They?

The short answer is they are initiated by the St. James Endowment Committee. The long answer is, more then a year ago, Pastor Richard Anderson, Director of Congregational Relations from Lutheran Social Service visited with The St. James Endowment Committee.

At that meeting Pastor Anderson introduced us to the concept of "One-to-One" visits with members of our Church called a "Faith Journey." The purpose of the visit is to build relationships within the congregation, to appreciate the journeys members have taken, and to share the contributions made in many different ways. With this in mind, the visits help members focus on their commitments to St. James and to the future for our Church.

The Endowment Committee agreed to give the concept a try. Pastor

Anderson's approach was to train many visitors and to visit all members in a short period of time. We have chosen to use a very deliberate pace. We first interviewed our Endowment board members. We are now visiting with staff members and council persons.

Thus far, we have been doing about one visit a month and sharing our conversations in the monthly Herald. If any member would like to be visited in the near future, we would be happy to meet with you. Mary Brown's Faith Journey

Mary is the daughter of a pastor and a musician, which explains a lot! In addition to pastorates, her father served as chaplain for Lutheran Social Service in Dayton, Ohio for a number of years. Her mother stopped teaching music in schools when she married, but continued to be involved in music with private students and as part-time organist. Mary's other brother earned a degree in music but did not make a career of it. Mary received some training but also learned on her own.

Mary's faith journey is hard to describe. It is necessary to disclose some unusual facts to get to today. Backing up to the period in which she was married, she sensed early on that her husband seemed discontent, always thinking that things would be better later on, sometimes yearning to obtain some material object. But it was more than that. He eventually got counseling and came to realize that he was born in the wrong body. He is now living as a woman somewhere in California.

Well, this left Mary in a pretty bad place. She spent years in a kind of fog, alternating between wondering where God was in all this and being certain that God was indeed with her. Unfortunately, a major coping mechanism was to go shopping and spend money beyond what was actually available. This led to severe consequences, but she has fought her way back to financial health and is now doing okay. In the future Mary would love to be in a position to include a monetary legacy in her estate. For now, sharing her music is indeed a tremendous gift to St. James.

During the years of fog and trouble, Mary kept a particular hymn in her mind: Send Us God, of new beginnings, humbly, hopeful into life. Use us as a means of blessing: make us stronger, give us faith. (ELW 603, vs. 4 Text: Fred Kaan)

Mary's children, Katie & Nick, are both doing well. And by the way, although Mary is of German heritage, she has become quite adept at rolling lefse!

A Note from Bonfire Executive

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Can you believe it? Summer is here!!! YIPPEE!! Summer is full of lots of activities and planning for the fall. The Bonfire Ministry collaboration between First Lutheran, House of Hope and St. James is no different. I want to invite you to five different activities that you will enjoy through Bonfire Ministry. The first is the three Bonfire Bonfires that will be held on the last Sunday of each summer month. The first was at First Lutheran on June 29. These Bonfire Bonfires will start at 6:30 p.m. and end around 8:00 p.m., or whenever the fire goes out and the last persons leave. PLEASE consider attending the Bonfire Bonfires that are taking place at each church; they are for EVERYONE. These bonfires are an opportunity to get to know the members of the other Bonfire congregations, with whom you are serving through Bonfire Ministry. The second bonfire is at St. James on July 27, and will give us an opportunity to welcome St. James' new pastor and the third bonfire will be on August 24 at House of Hope. I look forward to fellowshipping with you around a bonfire. Remember to bring a lounge chair or bag chair to sit upon.

Next, just a heads up; there are some changes coming in the way we fund Kid-Pack. You will be hearing about the Adopt-a-Student program throughout the summer, and we will need your gifts to make sure this ministry continues. In short you will be invited to adopt one or more students for the school year. The cost for the adoption is not final, but it will be in the \$55 range. You can, if you wish adopt more than one student and if you really want to you could adopt a whole classroom of children. Each Bonfire congregation will be asked to adopt 350 students. This is VERY DOABLE. We will need the funds to start arriving in August

because our first Kid-Pack packing date is August 26 @ 4:00 p.m. @ EFN. Come and join us, again for the fellowship and the service we do in Jesus' name.



I have mentioned the Grief Support Ministry that Bonfire is establishing. Our tentative calendar is set and we plan to begin our first 12-week session/course in mid-September. This Grief Support Ministry is for anyone who has or is experiencing grief from any source; the death of a loved one or friend, loss of a job, divorce, illness, etc. All are welcome; come yourself and invite friends you know who have or are experiencing grief.

Finally, mark Sept. 6/7 on your calendars for the Second Annual ELCA Day of Serving, God's Work-Our Hands. The specific tasks we will be doing have not yet been firmed up. We will be serving with the other Wildfire congregations and I have heard suggestions that we might have a cookout at the end of our serving. Again, God is giving us an opportunity for fellowship and serving in one package. What could possibly be easier?
