

Pastoral Reflection

Beloved Friends in Christ,


Freezer Meal Clubs

New Resource book in the St. James Library: *Provide & Protect-Important Life and Death Decisions* by A. Charles Schultz.

This book is an easy to read and understand resource about decisions families need to make as they journey through life. There are four sections to this book

You and Your Family: You will learn how to pass benefits to your family in very helpful ways.

Your Contacts and Healthcare: This will guide you on how to make sure your advisors are prepared to make decisions if you become incapacitated. If you have minor children, you will learn how to get reliable guardians.

Your Financials: Understanding different property ownership methods is essential to good planning. You will learn how to gather information for estate planning.

Your Estate Plan: This explains many planning options to provide the most benefits for your family. It will look at ways to take care of your immediate family, a larger circle of friends and relatives and to serve the needs of your favorite Church and Charities.

This book provides an access to a free online "Will Planner". Examples of different concepts are shown throughout the book. This book will clearly explain estate planning matters that are sometimes confusing and difficult to understand.

Library News

July's Outreach Partner: NEAR School Supplies

Once again St. James members have the opportunity to help get NEAR Food Shelf students ready for the start of school in September. Many supplies will be needed. NEAR volunteers have applied for help from the Caring Tree Org., but haven't heard if they will receive supplies.

These are the items most needed: backpacks, many two-pocket folders (red, yellow, green, blue), loose leaf paper (wide and college ruled), wide spiral notebooks, colored pencils, markers (fat and thin tip), pencil boxes, scissors (blunt), pencils, erasers, bottles of glue, rulers, and highlighters.

If you choose to donate money, it will be used for items not donated. You may make your check out to St. James with NEAR School on the memo line. Thank you for the \$583 donated last year.

Caribou Coffee partners will help bag supplies on the 1st Thur. in Aug.. These supplies will be distributed to the clients the week of Aug. 31 - Sept. 4th. Help is always needed anytime in August.

In 2014 NEAR served 201 families with 557 students. The totals were: 291 elementary, 125 middle school, and 141 high school. For 2015, the plan is to assemble supplies for 80, K-1st graders; 100, 2nd-3rd graders; 95, 4th-5th graders; 130 middle schoolers, and 145 high school students. The schools NEAR serves are: Forest, Meadow Lake, Lakeview, Plymouth Middle, Robbinsdale Middle, and Cooper High School.

Thanks for your help in getting the students in your community ready for school.

Dinner at Your Door Drivers

Bonfire Exec. Director's Message

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The summer is now fully upon us. Horary! Warm temps are here, opportunities to be outside are here, perhaps you have a trip or a vacation planned. Now's the time to do them all! There are lots of things we wait all winter to do and now we can do them. Planting flowers in the garden. Sitting outside in the evening (assuming the mosquitoes aren't too bad), enjoying a sunset. Summer is a time for people to get together. As I have said before, one of the goals of Bonfire Ministry is create the opportunities for fellowship between the members of the Bonfire congregations. One way we are doing this is through our summer Bonfire Bonfires. You are invited to First Lutheran Church on Sunday evening, July 26, at 5:30 p.m. for a time of fellowship, stories and delicious refreshments. Come and join us. We'd like to see each congregation represented with lots of people.

Some of what Bonfire Ministry does slows down during the summer, but we do not stop moving forward. One of the most important ministries we do together is our KidPack ministry. Each month during the school year we pack about 4,000 KidPacks for the students at Meadow Lake Elementary School, Forest Elementary School and the Robbinsdale Family Lit program. We serve approximately 1,150 individual students through this ministry, each getting a snack bag 3 times each month. Our budget for this ministry is

\$72,000 each year. That's a lot of money! But, Jesus didn't tell us to fret over the cost, but to feed the hungry and care for the least among us. That's what you are doing through KidPack. Thank You. We will begin the Adopt-A-Student fundraiser for KidPack again in early August. It costs \$54.00 to provide one child with a KidPack three times a month for the school year. Please consider adopting as many students as you can. Each adoption is important and makes a difference.

Remember, too, that KidPack is a wonderful ministry to support with a gift in honor or in memory of another. Those gifts can be given directly to Bonfire Ministry, with KidPack written in the Memo line, or they can be given through your congregation, again with KidPack written on the memo line.

Thank you for all the ways you support this ministry of outreach that is really an integral part of the mission work of each congregation. Bonfire Ministry is your congregation reaching out in your name with the good news of the Gospel.
