

"The Great Habits of Highly Effective Disciples"

The pastor of the largest ELCA congregation was asked about the most satisfying aspect of his work? He replied: "Seeing members turned into disciples."

A *member* is a person whose name is on the rolls. The qualifications range from minimal to none. Very little is actually required of members and not much more is expected.

But what are disciples? Simply put, they are followers of Jesus. The truth is that we are all called to be disciples- not merely members.

"Following Jesus" is a rather vague and generalized way to describe our calling as disciples. So, during our Wednesday Lenten services we will explore some "Habits of Highly Effective Disciples."

The following are the 'habits' to be considered:

March 12	Cross Bearing (Matt. 16:21-26)
March 19	<i>Keeping in Touch</i> (Mark 14:32-42)
March 26	<i>Compassionate</i> (Col. 3:12-14/Matt. 9:36-38)
April 2	Honest with Ourselves (Luke 23:32-43)
April 9	Anchored at the Center (Luke 23:44-49)

March's Outreach Partner: NEAR

Help provide warm, nutritious meals for families that have fallen on hard times by donating to the March Food Drive. This will be the 40th year that St. James has supported the NEAR Food Shelf. This serves the north half of New Hope, Crystal, and Robbinsdale.

In 2013, NEAR distributed each month an average of 39,693 pounds of food to 385 families. Each week new clients are added who are having trouble feeding themselves or families.

The food shelf stocks shelves, accepts food and sorts this food each morning with 8-10 volunteers. Each afternoon from 1:30 to 4:30 at least 20 families receive their monthly distribution. There are usually 5 volunteers at that time.

In March 2013, St. James donated

Partner: NEAR \$2,051 and 300 pounds of food. It is a great time to give since The Feinstein Corp. matches the giving for March and April. Book Club Reads Pomegranate Soup

March's pick: <u>Pomegranate Soup</u> by Marsha Mehran.

The three Aminpour sisters escape the Iranian Revolution and make their way west to a small Irish village. There they pursue a well-worn path to assimilation by taking over an abandoned Italian bakery and opening the Babylon Cafe. It takes a while to win over the insular townsfolk, but they manage to make a success of their restaurant, charming even the local priest. Food plays a pivotal role in the novel; Mehran includes recipes for some Iranian specialties. Stark contrasts between the sisters' lives in Iran and Ireland and between the Irish and Persian cultures energize Mehran's tale. [from Booklist]

Empty Bowls Fundraiser for NEAR

A Note From Bonfire Ex. Director

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Is anyone getting tired of winter yet? How about the cold temperatures we have been "enjoying" for the last couple of months? If you are anything like me, you are getting a bit weary of winter this year. The good news is "this winter too shall pass," and before long we will be getting tired of the heat and humidity of summer. But, there are a few weeks left of winter this year and with the harsh conditions we have been experiencing we are reminded of people who are having a hard time putting food on their tables to feed themselves and their families. I saw a news article today that said some of the people in Syria have been forced to "eat grass" because of the war in that country and the war's impact on the availability of food. So, here's the challenge for our Bonfire Ministry congregations; to step up to feed the hungry during March, which is MN FoodShare month.

We will have a small cargo trailer that will move between the congregations as a visual reminder of the hunger needs in our community. The trailer has a capacity of 360 cubic feet. That means it could figuratively hold 360 – one cubic foot boxes of food. The NEAR Food Shelf calculated that one cubic foot of food would cost \$20.00. So lets see how many times we can *"fill the trailer to feed the hungry."* If we fill it once, that's \$7,200 for the Food Shelf, if we can do it twice, that's \$14,400. That money plus the actual food that is donated will be a huge help in feeding the hungry in our community. During March you are encouraged to make as generous a donation to our Food Shelf as you are able. Actual food can also be donated and it has a value through the Food Shelf of \$1.00 per pound. To make a monetary donation, make a check out to your congregation and write Food Shelf on the memo line.

During March our Food Shelves are able to receive matching funds for the dollars and food they receive in donations. Together, let's take up the challenge to *"fill the trailer to feed the hungry"* as we heed Jesus' command to *"feed the hungry (Matthew 25:35)."*

I'll have more about some of the exciting things you are doing through Bonfire Ministry in next month's newsletter. Until then,

This is still very much in the planning stages, so details are still being worked out.


