

Pastoral Reflection

Friends in Christ,



In these first days of May, we draw encouragement from the warmth and beauty of spring and new life emerging in gardens and farm fields.

Plans for summer vacations, family gatherings, and outdoor activities stretch before us in splendid abundance. It's appropriate that our worship and scripture selections during May also stress the splendid abundance of life we receive from God through Christ our Lord. Because we are saved by God's grace, there is nothing for us to do for our salvation. All that is good we receive from God's overflowing love for us. Having been saved by God's grace alone, we are free to live abundant lives, no matter the circumstance. John 15: 1-8.

The last two Sundays of April and first Sunday of May, we will be celebrating God's generosity extended to our congregation, and the generous stewardship of our congregation. During my life, I have been inspired by many faithful, generous stewards. Think of someone who inspires and encourages you. Is it because of their wealth and fame, or does the blessing you receive from them come from some other source? Congregational Vote Results on Same Gender Marriage

St. James council members held two congregational discernment sessions to discuss the possibility of St. James performing same gender marriages in January of this year. A congregational vote was held on Sun., Feb. 8. With a 62 to 19 vote, St. James members passed the Same Gender Marriage Policy to allow gay marriages at St. James.

As outlined in the ELCA 2009 social statement on human sexuality, our denomination understands sexuality as a gift from God that has proper expression between two people — whether same or opposite gender — in a loving, committed, monogamous and publicly accountable relationship. Our congregations are encouraged to welcome and invite everyone into the full life of the church. In states where same-gender marriage is legal, Lutheran congregations may provide wedding hospitality.



Caring for Each Other in Christ

Sunday Morning Cards: Who receives them? Members of St. James who have been ill, hospitalized, shut-in, welcomed a new baby. Endowment Funds Report

There are five separate Endowment funds: Ruth Lund, Children's Ministries, Una Lamb, General-Capital and General-Benevolent. The total amount for all five funds as of December 31, 2014 was \$112,800. The collective growth was \$5,400, or just under 5%. Two grants were made in 2014, both from the Children's Ministries Fund. They were: \$288 for the 2014 youth summer trip and \$1,000 toward the 2015 National Youth Trip. All monies have been carried over into 2015. Any additional distributions other than the 2015 youth trip will be considered as the need arises. It should be noted that there are restrictions on most of the funds as to how much may be used and for what purposes.

St. James has several volunteers who donate their time to sort and pack medical supplies every Thursday. Global always welcomes more volunteers. Collections are being taken all year for the intergenerational event held in October. St. James will be assembling newborn kits and making rolled bandages for GHM. The rolled bandages are made from donated white sheets. Please consider donating items for the kits.

Newborn kit:

- 1 36 " square muslin or sheeting (unhemmed from any color sheet)
- 1 bath towel (new or gently used). No longer than 48".
- 1 wash cloth (new or gently used)
- 1 regular size bar of wrapped Ivory soap (10 packs at Family Dollar Store)
- 1 newborn stocking cap (patterns are available)
- 1 small shirt (patterns are available) or can be gently used
- 1 receiving blanket (new or gently used)

Especially needed are regular size bars of Ivory soap and bath towels.

Last year, St. James assembled 200 kits and a nice boxful of wrapped bandages. Hopefully we can make even more kits this year. Donated items can be left at the church and will be stored by Nancy Dahlquist until they are needed. Donations of money can also be used for purchasing materials for the kits. Bonfire Exec. Director's Message

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

There is an old adage that says, "the only constant in life is change." We don't like change, we like things the way they have always been. We like what we perceive to be the stability of the past and we fear the unknown of the future, when change is in the air. Bonfire Ministry has changed the way our three congregations do ministry outside of the walls of the building we occupy. Bonfire Ministry has been a "change agent" in this community demonstrating the vitality of the Gospel as we have and reaching out to make a difference in the lives of the people in this community. It was a change when I was called to serve as the Executive Director; we had never done it that way before. Now there is another change on the horizon. Melodie Hanson has been the point person for Bonfire and our KidPack ministry. She has taken care of ordering the food each month through The Food Group. She has taken care of reminding our volunteers of the packing times and She has kept the tally of the dates. number of students at each school receiving KidPacks, etc. She has been an invaluable gift to KidPack. Now, because of her work requirements, she is no longer able to spend the time needed to do all these KidPack related jobs. First of all a HUGE - THANK YOU to Melodie. We appreciate all you have done; you are a blessing to us and to this community! Second, we will need a volunteer to take over the jobs Melodie has been doing. This person will not be responsible for writing Grant Applications, just doing the tasks listed above. I ask that each of you reading this note prayerfully consider volunteering your time and your gifts to this ministry. If you are interested, I will set up a meeting time with you, Melodie and myself to go over the specific tasks and expectations. There is someone within the Bonfire Ministry congregations who has the gifts, the time, and the willingness to help. Please pray about it.

First Lutheran: the 2nd Sunday of the month, and Tuesdays 9:00 - 11:00 a.m.


