Pastoral Reflection

Our beautiful summer continues, the garden has produced abundant amounts of green beans, sweet corn, beets, zucchini, tomatoes and cucumbers. We live in peace and enjoy the good life our community, state and



nation provide. We know that every blessing, every good thing in life is from God, for our blessing, and entrusted to our care, our faithful stewardship. And we know that our congregation, St. James Lutheran in Crystal, is a blessing, a good thing in our lives which is also entrusted by God to our care.

Change by Not Changing: Worship Service Decision

At our congregation's council meeting on Monday evening, August, 18, the worship committee's recommendation that our worship life continue into the fall with one worship service at 9:30 a.m. was accepted and considered carefully. The council also considered the valuable feedback which it had received in the two listening sessions it sponsored on Wednesday night, August 13 at 7:00 p.m. and Sunday, August 17 following the 9:30 a.m. worship service. After thoughtful conversation in which many perspectives and preferences were shared, the council voted to adopt the worship committee's recommendation with the following changes and additions:

- 2. A task force will begin immediately to gather the information and resources needed to create and implement a new worship service at St. James. This worship service will be held at a time and day to be finalized by the council upon receiving the recommendations of the New Worship Task Force.

Children in those households simply do not get enough to eat—they have to cut the size of their meals, skip meals, or even go whole days without food at some point during the school year. Hungry children face unnecessary barriers as they strive to become healthy, productive, and engaged members of society. Hunger contributes to poor academic performance and disruptive behavior in the classroom. Missed meals also increase tardiness and visits to the school nurse.

Many children in these schools simply don't get enough to eat, especially on weekends when they do not have access to free or reduced-priced lunches. This contributes to poor academic performance, disruptive behavior, increased tardiness, and increased visits to the school nurse. These kids need your help to end their weekend hunger!

It will be held on Saturday, September 13, 2014 at the Cooper High School tennis courts. The entry fee is \$20/person, which includes a t-shirt if you sign up by September 6th. Bonfire Exec. Director's Message

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Where did the summer go? It's fall already and we are ready to get into our fall schedules. Bonfire Ministry is no exception. KidPack starts on August 26 @ 4:30 p.m. @ EFN. We will be packing snack bags for children at Forest and Meadow Lake Elementary Schools and the Robbinsdale Family Lit Program again this year. It looks like it will be another grand year of caring for these children and their families. Come and join us, again, for the fellowship and the service we do in Jesus' name. I want to remind you that we have changed the funding model for KidPack this year. You will be hearing more about the Adopt-A-Student program during worship announcements and we hope you will be generous and Adopt at least one and perhaps more students for KidPack. There will be donation envelopes in the church pews soon and a couple of thermometer graphs to help you know how we are doing at reaching our goal. It costs Bonfire Ministry approximately \$80,000 per year to fund the KidPack ministry we do together.

The cost to adopt a student is \$54. You can, if you wish adopt more than one student and if you really want to you could adopt a whole classroom of children. Each Bonfire congregation, along with Holy Nativity Lutheran Church will be asked to adopt 350 students. This is VERY DOABLE.

I have mentioned the Grief Support Ministry that Bonfire is establishing. Our tentative calendar is set and we plan to begin our first 12-week session/course in mid-September. This Grief Support Ministry is for anyone who has or is experiencing grief from any source; the death of a loved one or friend, loss of a job, divorce, illness, etc. All are welcome; come yourself and invite friends you know who have or are experiencing grief. Finally, mark Sept 6 on your calendars for the Second Annual ELCA Day of Serving, God's Work-Our Hands. We will be dividing into two groups with one group working at Second Harvest Food Shelf and the other tying blanket edges at Holy Nativity for children attending Camp Noah; a camp for children who have experienced severe trauma in their lives. Following our time of service we will all gather, along with those who couldn't work but would like to experience the fellowship, at Northwood Park on Boone and 38th Ave., around noon for a picnic and fellowship.
