## March's Outreach Partner: NEAR Food Shelf

Did you know that hunger is a daily issue in many homes? There are about 300 food shelves in the state of Minnesota that need food to stock an inventory for the summer months, when children are at home and giving is down. Each person should receive 15 pounds per month, which should cover three meals a day for three days. We can't escape the numbers: 10% of Minnesotans don't know where their next meal will come from. The need is greater than ever.

Many individuals coming into the Food Shelf just can't make it month to month.

Especially needed are canned vegetables, fruits, meats, and meals. If you choose to donate money, make the check to St,. James with NEAR on the memo line. Be a hero! Fight hunger!

May St. James "Pack The Pews" with food and monies! Remember you can fill a box for \$20. There is a percentage of matching funds available all of March and April from the Feinstein Corp.
